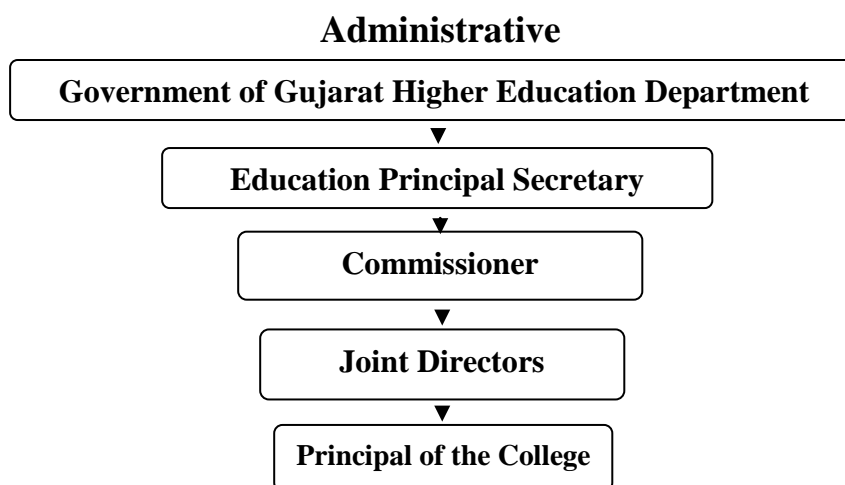

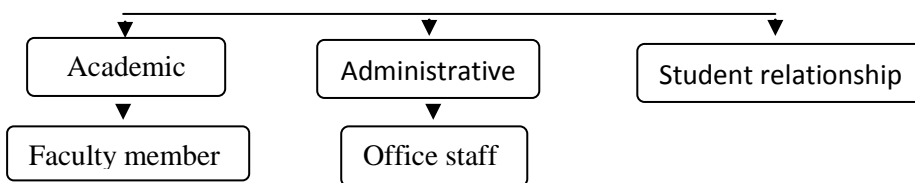
- ▶ To arrange the activities to be carried through out the year proper planning of those activities is to be made. There is always an administrative aspect of every activity.

- Expansion of earn while you learn programmes.


Challenges
